## Testimonial Polo Forest Reserve - Volunteer Training Camp Report -Darshan Jardosh

Volunteers are the backbone of any organization. This is true for Nature Club Surat as well. Our volunteers play an important role in conducting different activities of the club. To conduct these activities, volunteers must possess skills in many areas. It is therefore essential that the skills of the volunteers are continuously enhanced.
